Bridge education update. Unit board members Sam Madison and Wendy Vaughn Platt plus a few intrepid volunteers are spearheading an effort to bring the game of bridge to elementary school students in San Diego. They have two schools enrolled (McKinley and Loma Portal Elementary Schools) where they hold regular classes for upper elementary students. "We need children to take up bridge because they are the future," Sam said recently. "The game helps them get involved in social activities and will improve their mental skills. If we don't get youngsters involved, the game will die out."

The program uses Patty Tucker's "Bridge is for Kids" teaching materials plus backpacks, decks of cards, certificates of completion, letters to the parents, and winner's trophies – all provided by ACBL. Wendy, a certified instructor, points out that the materials are written and presented in a sway that nine- and ten-year-olds can pick up the basics. "As they do," she says, "the kids get more and more excited each day to come and play."

More schools are being considered for the program, and an overture has also been made to the Navy to hold classes for interested service members. Those programs could be at the Naval Amphibious Base and/or North Island Naval Air Station. Details are being worked out.
